The soul. Our soul is longing for God. We come in touch with our soul in solitude.

The American soul is bruised and bleeding because of our unceasing activity. We don't know how to be quiet before God. In solitude, I remove myself from activity and noise and wait in God's Presence. God is in control; I am not.

Solitude is an entry point into the spiritual practices. It opens the way to prayer, fasting, study, meditation.
